Louisa May Alcott's classic semi-autobiographical novel of Civil War era has given rise to no fewer than four movie versions, and even one opera. The beloved story made it's way to Broadway as a musical in 2005 and first hit the FMT stage a mere three years later in 2008. As FMT enters our 30th anniversary season, we wanted to revisit beloved shows of our past – and Little Women was right there at the top of our list. This musical embodies much of the heart of FMT – with it's strong story of vision, family, and survival through hardship. The four March sisters and their beloved mother weather the absence of their father, hardships of the war, growing pains of sibling rivalries/discovered love/death - and despite the pains, they survive... together. Jo's strong will and dreams to achieve greatness is not unlike FMT's pursuit of excellence without compromise of our family-safe nature. We may be small, but we have giant plans as well! Alcott put it best herself: "We all have our own life to pursue, our own kind of dream to be weaving, and we all have the power to make wishes come true, as long as we keep believing." I hope this production will bring you reminders to treasure your family, and to keep pursuing your dreams.
